



Emily used the Fancy Pants place mat pattern as a mask, spraying over her foundation cardstock with white spray ink. This created a great background texture on which to design the rest of her ocean sidethemed page.


Emily's die cut keys, placed below her title, cue the reader that "New Quay" is pronounced "new key."

With leftovers from the primary six supplies, Emily created this beautiful, tropical card. She fussy cut several flowers found on one of the patterned papers and layered them around a banner sentiment with foam adhesive.

The design of this fresh, sunnery card would be perfect for a bon voyage theme or even just a simple thank you.



Mix and match patterned papers like a pro! BY KELLY GOREE

Our resident paper mixologist is here to help you break it down, cut it out and make it work.

I've always joked that the easiest part of scrapbooking is buying the supplies! But seriously, who doesn't love picking up some fresh sheets of patterned paper from their local scrapbook store, knowing they will be the perfect match for their photos? Yet, when it comes down to using those beautiful papers, you sometimes discover that they overwhelm your precious photos, and your photos are what the process is all about! When I hit the proverbial "patterned paper brick wall," here are a few tips and tricks that I try, not only to keep my photos front and center but to enhance them, too!

Keep your patterns to a minimum.

Use just one or, if you're really feeling brave, two bold patterns that compliment your photos. All other patterns should be very small and subtle.

Forget the dominant colour of your photos. Instead, choose an accent colour from the photos and use it to quide your paper selections—a trick that will make your photos POP!

Frame the focal photo. Select a complementary solid colour to mat your photo and set it apart. There really was a reason we used to do this to all our photos back in the day.

Now, it's your turn! Go grab that favourite photo that you've been afraid to put on a layout, and make it shine with these few simple tips!







Kelly's beautiful page celebrates her youngest son's first year of life. The number "1" is the crowd pleaser on this creative layout.

She began by creating a digital cutting file, then filled in several of the negative circles with the number one, both numeric and spelled out. After attaching this cut out piece to her page, Kelly further embellished the negative circles with pen work and die cut stars. An oversized title subdivides the layout and a fun, numeric patterned paper carries the theme to the right side of the page.

Xelly wrapped a length of paper cording around the three buttons suspended vertically down the center of her page. How cute!



Chronicling an entire vacation or long weekend getaway can be a time-consuming task. When you don't have the time to devote to multiple pages, take a tip from Lynn and chronicle one eventful day of your trip, like she did when her family enjoyed a weekend retreat to New York City. She simply scrapbooked the highlights on this well-designed page.

Lynn used a timeline theme for her double page, marking the time each photo was taken throughout the day in a digital clock fashion with black stickers. She started and ended the photo timeline with snapshots of the digital clock inside their rental car (now that's great planning!) and topped off the page with a layered set of journaling tags.



The red accents on Lynn's page are very eye-catching and help direct the reader from her title through her timeline photos.


Using a combination of pre-printed and hand-written speech bubbles, Christa narrated her adventures of flying down a zip line and spread them out across the top and bottom of her page. These tailored segments of journaling became additional design elements on her page, which she dressed up with dimensional embellishments and word stickers.

tags tell the tale

When Sheri's young daughter looks back on this page years from now, her mother's thoughtful journaling will help her to recall the smallest details of an otherwise forgotten childhood summer. Sheri computer-journaled paragraphs, trimmed into tags, tell short snippets about each photo. Word stickers and printed die cuts share in the storytelling on this beautifully designed page.

A journaling technique like this would be perfect on a double page about a wedding, a baby's first year, or a holiday celebration, events that frequently have a lot of journaling.







easy, detailed, expert

Whatever level of difficulty appeals to you, our easy, detailed, expert column has fantastic ideas to try today!

I am a "moody" scrapbooker, meaning that sometimes I am in the mood to simply tell the story, while other times I want to spend hours creating a work of art. I love that this hobby allows me to switch things up, try new techniques and make things as simple or as detailed as I'd like. For this assignment, I actually began with the expert layout first and then changed the design elements for the easy and detailed pages.






this summer

supplies CARDSTOCK, American Crafts; PATTERNED PAPER, BORDER STICKER, Echo Park; BUTTON, October Afternoon; PHOTO CORNERS, Canson; CORNER ROUNDER Fiskars; ADHESIVE, Xvron; OTHER, cotton twine

For my easy page, I cut a sheet of sunburst paper in half to mount on the top portion of my layout, creating an eye-catching element. Then I added a phrase border strip and a border strip sticker across the center of the layout to create a title. I matted my photos onto a piece of green cardstock, anchoring the corners with photo corners. A single line of journaling, printed on white cardstock and placed below the photos, tells the story of a fun day at the beach. To unify the entire page, I matted it onto a summery shade of blue cardstock.




For my detailed layout, I fussy cut the sun burst from yellow patterned paper, outlining each ray with faux pen stitches. I added some dictionary patterned paper to the bottom section of the layout and replaced part of the title with bright orange letter stickers and kraft tags. Additional embellishments, such as decorative washi tape and enamel dots, give the layout texture and dimension. I carried forward the blue cardstock foundation for continuity.


My expert layout is where the little details really make the page shine. Again, I fussy cut the sunburst from the patterned paper, but replaced the pen stitches with machine stitching. I added subtle background stamping, a die cut title and a swag of die cut pennants above my layering photos. Small embellishments dot the page, making this layout entirely my own and true to my style.




challenge: retro products

Eyelets, no doubt, found their way into storage jars because our households hated the loud pounding we made at two in the morning, trying to set the little buggers! That problem has been solved with the (very quiet) Crop-A-Dile eyelet setter by We R Memory Keepers.



Lynn used an eyelet pattern on her beautiful page, cutting it out of white cardstock on a Silhouette. Rather than gluing it down flat, she placed it over light blue paper and sewed it in place with a few zig zag stitches. This allowed the eyelet pattern to float on top of the page, giving it added depth. SCT



- 4 Trim a 3.625"x4.875" piece of yellow polka-dot paper and adhere it to the blue paper.
- 5 Stamp sentiment on the bottom, right corner with black ink.
- 6 Cut two flip flops from white cardstock.
- 7 Cut the top of the flip flops from tan patterned paper.
- 8 Embellish each flip flop with a die cut flower and create a tie from black cardstock. Add brads to centers of flowers.
- 9 Design a coordinating envelope with a punched heart on the back, if desired.

- 1 Make a 4.25"x5.5" card from white cardstock, with opening on the bottom.
- 2 Trim a 2"x5.5" piece of blue patterned paper and adhere to top of card base.

- 4 Cut brown paper to create a palm tree trunk.

- 6 Punch a "sun" from chevron patterned paper. Adhere it to the left edge of the card and trim off excess paper.

- 8 Design a coordinating envelope with a die cut anchor on the front, if desired.

Connect to that place inside yourself that holds these words. We all have them within us. The more you call on these words the easier it will be to bring them forth again and again. Don't miss a chance to write these precious feelings and memories down.



idea 1: i love you because

Tell someone how much they mean to you by using the simple repeated phrase, "I love you because..." Starting each sentence with these four words simplifies the process of having to come up with multiple sentences. Consider adding reasons that are both silly and serious to tell a more complete story. Keep in mind the age of the person you are writing to and your relationship. If you have more to say you might want to consider a layout design that allows for longer sentences.

Examples I included in my journaling were: I love you because you keep trying. I love you because you teach me every day. I love you because you are a hard-worker. I love you because you are totally fun. I love you because you have the most awesome spirit.

love you because

- Write around the circles using the repeated phrase, "I love you because..."
- 2 Go big with a photo. I'm a huge fan of using enlargements for impact. The one included on this layout is 9"x12".
- Use a stencil and paint to create a group of small circles. Add an eclectic mix of embellishments to the circles. creating a home for each.
- Don't forget the date. For some reason this tends to be easy for me to forget!

idea 2: wishes for you

As I go about my everyday life (stuff like making coffee, driving my daughter to school, making dinner, weeding), I often think of little wishes I have for my kids. Many times they come to me in the form of "may you..." These are little sentiments, often reflections or lessons learned in my own life, that they may not understand at this time in their lives (ages 4 and 11), but my hope is that someday they will read them and know some of my wishes for them

I could probably write an entire book of these wishes (an idea for another day, right?). In fact, as I write this, I'm making a note in Evernote to collect these ideas. If you don't know about Evernote you should check it out. It's a great free app for collecting ideas.

These little wishes are so important. They are direct messages that document and demonstrate love, hopes, dreams and life experience.

- 1 Create a grid using washi tape. Add your content inside each square of the grid.
- 2 Stamp a repeated phrase or title before adding journaling.
- 3 Keep it simple and focus on the sentiments you want to convey.
- 4 Get comfortable writing with a pen. Know that I make mistakes all the time and just figure out ways to cover them up or live with them. It's part of the charm.

idea 3: write a letter

Another way to communicate, beyond just the basics, is to write a letter. It's a fantastic opportunity to tell someone how you feel about them and how they have impacted your life. Using a letter as the foundation for your journaling is a simple format that just about everyone has some familiarity with. It starts with a "to...", includes everything you want to say in the middle, and



ends with "sincerely," "love" or some other sentiment.


Your letter might be written to a child, your parents, spouse, grandparents, a teacher, or maybe even to yourself. I find this an especially effective tool when I have a story that might be a little more challenging to tell, yet I'd like to include it in my scrapbook. Perhaps the special loved one who you would like to write to is gone. Write to them anyway. What do they mean to you? What did they teach you? How did they change your life? What are the things you've always wanted to tell them? Write it all down.

After you take advantage of the opportunity to document these thoughts and feelings, make sure to share them with your loved ones if they are still with you. Get on the phone. Send an email. Scan your page or re-type your journaling. Life is too short to not include these types of pages in your album. You can do it!



- 1 Pair a new and an old photo together for a fun contrast between yesterday and today.
- 2 Draw lines on pattern paper before adding your journaling.
- 3 I love mixed fonts and handwriting. Use a stamp to repeat the "thank you" sentiment again and again at the start of each sentence.
- 4 Your letter doesn't have to look like a traditional letter. Add a big title, like the one that I cut out with a Silhouette machine.
