## The foundation of my traveller's notebook is a premade notebook

created just for this purpose. The blank pages are great for sketches, doodles, and photos, and it's a great size to pop in carry-on luggage. Often these notebooks come with a pocket inside the cover where you can store tickets and memorabilia from your trip!

### MAKE IT TIP: Add bulk to your


cover. Due to the nature of traveller's notebooks, chipboard stickers and other bulky embellishments can be hard to incorporate within the pages of the notebook. However, the cover is fair game for fun dimensional elements like the tassels Lused.

MAKE IT TIP: Create a closure. An easy solution to tame the bulkiness of your notebook is to create a closure by using some elastic string and a clear button. Simply thread the button with the string, and tie the ends of the string together. The loop created can easily be used as a hook over the button.

MAKE IT TIP: Set the tone. Create a title page to share the excitement of your departure! The requisite "wing-of-the-airplane" photo and the shot of your coffee in the airport as you wait to board allows you a place to tell the who, what, where, when, and why of your adventure.



MAKE IT TIP: Go BIG with photos. What's a vacation without a bunch of photos to remember every last minute? Sometimes there will be one photo that captures the moment perfectly. Don't be afraid to blow it up and make it the basis for one entire spread.



MAKE IT TIP: Layer it up. Add a photo flip design to incorporate lots of snapshots from your trip. You can intersperse journaling cards and photos and add the date with a date stamp.



MAKE IT TIP: Pull out your stamps. Stamps and traveller's notebooks go hand-in-hand. Small phrase stamps, icons, letters, and background builders are always a source of inspiration.
