

GETTING STARTED

A shaped base makes a really fun and unique album! Here I've chosen a flower and created a cut file which you can download for free on the SCT website so you can make this album, too! The cut file comes with a solid flower, a flower to back, and a few options with holes for adding hand stitching.

MAKE IT TIP: Mix and match.

Mixing and matching the type of base (solid/backed cut file/stitched) makes turning every page a treat and surprise.

MAKE IT TIP: Add dimensional pretties. String charms/beads/ tassels onto the binder ring holding the album together for the perfect and cutest finishing touches.

MAKE IT TIP: Make it durable. Set an eyelet (remember those?) through at least the front and back covers for durability to help the album withstand everyday wear and tear.

MAKE IT TIP:

Maximize it! Create pockets for additional photos, journaling spots, or ephemera, and make flip-ups to add even more photos.





MAKE IT TIP: Perk up the petals. The petals of the flowers make really fun spots for individual letters to make a word, enamel dots, or tiny flower stickers.





MAKE IT TIP: Not every page needs a photo—some can be made just for the sake of having fun and being creative, such as the string art transparency page. As I was stitching, I strung on a sequin for sparkle and shine.
