

pg 1: have your selfie ...

tip: use your camera phone and a self-timer app to capture a fun holiday photo

Who doesn't love a great family photo? I know I dol But the reality is, sometimes it's tricky to get one. Last Christmas Eve, I came up with a modern, inexpensive solution: I put my cell phone on a shelf and used an app that let's you trip the shutter by clapping (see more details about the clap app on page 55).

We sat on the couch. I clapped my hands. Family selfie magic ensued. With the number of camera apps including self-timers today, you can create a fun family-selfie moment just about anywhere.

Not sure about camera-phone placement? I have a little gadget called a GripTight Mount (see sidebar on page 55) that screws into my tripod and holds my phone securely in place. It has been amazing for selfies of all kinds.

The point is, when you let go of grand expectations for the perfect family photo, you might find your cell phone is the key to creating a truly memorable holiday portrait.


pg 2: ho ho ...

tip: put your Instagram images to work on a simple grid design
