MEGHANN'S DESIGN TIPS: Bold backgrounds!

- When using only a few supplies, try a patterned paper background to make the design feel
- Trim your photos with a white margin for an instant photo mat.
- Anchor your title with a strip of patterned paper to ground it and add balance to your design.

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pocket play

Short on time? Here you'll find creative ideas to make the most of your pocket pages. BY PAM BALDWIN

I have been using pocket pages to document my family's story for almost nine years,

and the thing that keeps me coming back is simply this—I love our stories. I love our everyday moments, the conversations, the snippets of life, the good, the bad, the ugly, and especially the funny. I love how each pocket becomes a home for a piece of our story. And I love how this simple combination of photos and words comes together to tell a more complete story than either one could possibly tell on its own.



POCKET TIP #1: Achieve balance with contrast. When the photos have lots of bright colours, select neutral products so that they don't compete with the photos.

POCKET TIP #2: Place photos mindfully. When you're working with photos that have bold/bright colours, spread them across the layout rather than clustering them all together.

POCKET TIP #3: Look for repeating shapes. I love all the circles that naturally appear in this spread: the pumpkins, the sink, and even some of our Halloween decorations. I took a cue from that and found that circular embellishments were an excellent fit to complement the photos in this spread.

Show a variety of perspectives.

Our brains are wired to look at faces in photos, so it's actually helpful to pick a variety of photos, including the ones that DON'T show off those big beautiful smiles. This way, the viewer can focus on the details of what you want to communicate with your photos.




PHOTO TIP: Make sure you get YOURSELF in the photos, too (even if it's just your feet). In the years to come, our kids will like seeing pictures of themselves in our albums, but they'll LOVE seeing us there even more.

PHOTO TIP: Get low. In the photo of my kids playing in the leaves, I took the photo from below for a playful perspective.

DESIGN TIP: Use filler cards that feature a similar design. The two quote cards create simple repetition on this page, unifying the design.

Summarize the season. It's a fantastic opportunity to express gratitude! And BONUS—doing this type of page may prompt you to get some pictures of the things you wouldn't normally think of. Consider it a challenge to capture images in new and creative ways like the golden quality of light and long shadows that seem especially spectacular in the fall.

TIPS

POCKET TIP #1: Type your journaling. Because typed text is smaller than my handwriting, I can fit more of the story into that little 3 x 4 space, plus it creates a very clean look.

POCKET TIP #2: Add stitching. I love the texture and dimension of adding a bit of sewing/stitching in my pages. It keeps things flat while creating more visual texture and an appealing handcrafted look.

POCKET TIP #3: Avoid bulky pages. Adding digital word art and journaling to photos before printing them is a nice way to embellish your pictures without the bulk.

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dynamic 3D designs

Say goodbye to boring old flat cards and layouts and add dynamic depth with 3D elements! OK, so maybe flat cards and layouts aren't a bad thing, but we're here to give you some fun tips and tricks to create dimensional fun in your papercrafts. I have a feeling your wheels will be turning once you get to the end of this article.

DESIGN TIP: Flick some paint splotches

on your background for added texture and whimsy. You can also try this technique on a card project!



stack and layer paper shapes

Paige gathered patterned papers in yellows, pinks, and blues and used her electronic die cut machine to cut the same flower in six sizes. That's the beauty of cut files: You can make them any size you want! Once she'd cut all the flowers, she layered them up for a floral embellishment with a whole lot of WOW!

DESIGN TIP: Check out the cool placement of the key elements of Paige's layout—the little words and phrases make a trail down the middle of the layout with the cutie pie photo a little bit south of dead center. Pop the flowers on either side in a visual triangle, and the big polka dots on either side serve as a place for your eyes to rest.

add lots of texture

What makes this card so pretty are the various textures

that Melissa used. Glitter cardstock, corrugated paper, wood veneer, cardstock, and patterned paper leaves add glamour and beauty to this fall greeting.

STEP-BY-STEP

- 1 Make card from cardstock; adhere patterned paper to card base and round corners.
- 2 Die cut frame from cardstock. Stamp sentiment and images on inner portion of frame. Adhere frame to card base and adhere inner portion with foam tape.
- 3 Die cut various leaves from cardstock, glitter cardstock, patterned paper, and corrugated paper; adhere leaves to frame.
- 4 Adhere wood leaves and affix enamel dots.

DESIGN TIP: Gather all of that texture in one spot so that the design doesn't turn out too fussy.

add lots of layers

Gather lots of goodies that pair well together and layer, layer, layer! There are so many pretty touches on this card. Some coordinating papers, a stamp, a couple of die cuts, and a few stickers layer up to 3D perfection!

STEP-BY-STEP

- 1 Make card from cardstock. Trim cardstock panel and adhere patterned paper to top portion; adhere panel to card base.
- ② Die cut oval from patterned paper and adhere to card.
- 3 Trim patterned paper strip and adhere. Die cut decorative edge from patterned paper and adhere.
- Stamp spider web on cardstock and die cut into oval; adhere to card with foam tape.
- 6 Layer stickers on oval.
- Adhere sentiment sticker and enamel dots.

happy halloween

DESIGN TIP: Not getting the depth you want with one foam square? Stack another on top of it for even more height. How many layers will you dare to add?

layout 2



give height with 3D foam

This technique is simple to do on layouts and cards. Pop it up with some foam adhesive! Pop up die cut shapes, photos, whatever you want to give your creations a lift. Pop up a house and add foam to another house on top of that! The shadows add depth to the design just like that.

DESIGN TIP: Crop a photo in a circle and add a beautiful crocheted frame around it to make it both dimensional and a gorgeous focal point.

Three dimensional cards are hot, and boy are they fun to look at! Lawn Fawn makes it easy to create this adorable autumn pop-up card with clever dies that will take the guesswork out of the equation.

DESIGN TIP: Little stamps are fun for creating box cards! Colour up a few fall friends and gather them for a fall celebration, 3D-style.

STEP-BY-STEP


- 1 Die cut yellow cardstock with pop-up die. You'll need two panels to create the box, as well as two insert flaps and flag pieces; assemble and adhere box.
- 2 Die cut patterned paper with pop-up die side pieces; adhere to flaps and sides of box.
- 3 Die cut patterned paper with bunting die, adhere to flag poles, and trim excess.
- 4 Die cut leaves from cardstock and patterned paper and adhere.
- 5 Stamp images on cardstock, colour with markers, and trim; adhere with foam tape.
- 6 Stamp sentiment on cardstock, trim, and adhere.

Some sentiment dies come with shadows which add instant depth to your sentiment. Pop it up on an already popped-up wreath for even more depth!

STEP-BY-STEP

- 1 Make card from cardstock. Trim glitter cardstock into panel.
- 2 Trim slightly smaller rectangle from woodgrain cardstock and apply ink; let dry and adhere to panel.
- 3 Stamp wreath, die cut, and adhere with foam tape.
- 4 Die cut layered thanks with green and orange cardstock; adhere together and adhere to wreath with foam tape.
- 5 Stamp sentiment on cardstock, trim into banner, and adhere with foam tape.
- 6 Adhere enamel dots.
- Adhere panel to card base with foam tape.

DESIGN TIP: Dip into your patterned paper scraps with this technique and create a unique and colourful quilt. Choose a few colour families and go from there.

DESIGN TIP: Check out your stash for goodies that are the same shape (or at least similar). Gather them all in one spot for a happy design element. There's something delightful about the abundance of a repeated shape.



back to school






DESIGN TIP: Instead of stitching, Jodi popped up the squares to give depth to her Halloween tic-tac-toe.

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product play

Stencils have long been a staple in creativity. Let's explore what they have to offer!

Many of our partners offer a wide array of stencils. They range from pretty and intricate to spare and geometric with lots of fun options in between! But how do you get the most out of these awesome little design doodads? Jennifer S. Gallacher is here to share three clever ways to use your stencils.



START SMALL

If you're too skittish to stencil directly on your layout or card,

start small with experiments. Secure the stencil to some cardstock on your workspace and add some embossing paste in a thin layer through the stencil. Once your design is dry, die cut it into shapes (Jennifer chose circles) and use them as unique design elements on a layout or card. If you mess it up, try again. It's just paper!

STENCIL TIP: Apply gold embossing paste through a stencil, let dry, and then die cut the embossed designs into circles to use as an embellishment on your project.

STENCIL TIP: When using embossing paste, it's recommended that you clean your stencil with hot water right after you're done to make sure that you can get it clean.

USE THE STENCIL WITH ACRYLIC PAINT

Remember back in the '80s when we were stenciling designs on our kitchen walls in shades of dusty blue and dusty rose? That same concept still works but with updated designs for the 21st century! Again, secure the stencil to your work surface with masking tape (for crisp edges) and use acrylic paint to pounce the colour into the design for best results. Let it dry and use it as an awesome backdrop for a pretty fall frame like Jennifer did!

STENCIL TIP: Use acrylic paint to pounce colour through a stencil to create a backdrop for a layout, card, or home décor piece.

STENCIL TIP: Use a light hand. You can always go back and add more colour, but if you add too much all at once, it's time to grab another sheet and try again.



STENCIL TIP: Reserve a different foam applicator for each colour so that things don't get muddy.

BLEND INKS THROUGH A STENCIL WITH A BLENDING TOOL

Let the pretty design of the stencil shine with beautiful colours of ink blended through it. The cool thing about this technique is that you can vary the look based on how large of an ink stash you have! You can try a rainbow, warm or cool colours, or various shades of one colour family for an ombré effect.

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design school

Grab your notebook and your backpack, because we're headed back to school—Design School!

Have you ever stared at a project in process and wondered why it just didn't look "right?" It's likely that one of the rules of design will make it all come together.

In this issue we want to dive into the idea of Line. Achieving balance is essential to good design. Balance is the way the elements of a card (lines, shapes, colours, textures, etc.) are arranged to create a feeling of stability; a pleasing or harmonious arrangement or proportion. Horizontal lines can be calm and quiet or an anchor, while vertical lines can convey movement. Let's take a look at some examples that will teach this rule:



layout 1

LINE TO SEPARATE CONTENT

Create areas for photos, accents, journaling, and your title, with intentional and obvious lines. You'll notice that Sheri paid close attention to our rule of thirds lesson (which we covered in our spring issue)—the photo of her daughter on the left takes up one third of the layout, and the other two thirds include smaller photos, accents, her title, and another photo. Each section is separated by a line. It all just FITS, you know what I mean?

life is good

DESIGN TIP: Sheri's journaling doesn't fit in the grid created by the lines, and that totally works. Since it sticks out a little bit, your eyes will stop and look. Again, completely intentional design.

layout 2



DESIGN TIP: Consider this when placing photos on a layout—if the subject is leaning or looking left, place that photo on the right. That way the subject's stance will lead you IN to the layout rather than out of it.

so filled with gratitude

THE PSYCHIC LINE Use the angle or glance of the subject in the photo to choose where to arrange things in your layout. The psychic line isn't seen, but rather it is felt. Lean in for this one... Take a look at the glance of Jen's daughter—it appears that she is looking directly at the title. So when you first glanced at the layout, it's likely you looked at the photo and then the title, which led you to the florals and then the journaling, up to the date and back to the photo. Right? We must be psychic. But seriously... it's all intentional beginning with the glance and stance in the photo.

cards 1 & 2



LINE TO CREATE MOVEMENT

Incorporate lines intentionally to create movement.

Horizontal lines can convey stillness while vertical lines can give a sense of height (think reclining or standing positions). In this card, Mindy's lines of embellishments (from smaller to larger) make the ghosties feel like they are swooping up into the sky!

DESIGN TIP: Notice how the ghost on the left and the ghost on the right both point to the middle with their bottoms. Yep, that's the psychic line bringing your eye IN to the middle of the design.

happy halloween

RADIATING LINES

Direct the eye right where you want it with radiating or diagonal lines. Diagonal lines give depth as well as a lack of stability. In this design, the lines draw you RIGHT to the focal point ghost and sentiment, and if you squint, it might appear that the ghost is wiggling. How fun is that?

DESIGN TIP: The spooky village on the hill gives weight to the design so it doesn't feel like it will fall over. Plus, the hill introduces an additional curvy line into the design, intersecting with the radiating rays. Bonus line!





We love 'em. We collect 'em. We can't stop cutting with 'em! Try your hand at the die cut techniques we're sharing over the next five pages!

UNCONVENTIONAL SHAPE DIE CUTTING


DESIGN TIPS:

- Stray from the rectangle! Any large die cut can be used to create a shaped card that will cause a sensation. See step 5 in Latisha's instructions to see how easy it is.
- Add vellum to your designs to soften colours or give your design a bit of mystery. It's PERFECT for Halloween cards!

STEP-BY-STEP

- 1 Die cut two scalloped rectangles from dark grey cardstock and one from vellum.
- 2 Die cut reversed scallop rectangle from the middle of one of the dark grey rectangles created in step 1.
- 3 Die cut spider web from glitter cardstock and adhere to the back of frame rectangle created in step 2. Trim any excess and adhere vellum scalloped rectangle behind spider web.
- 4 Trim light grey cardstock panel and adhere frame with spider web and vellum.
- 5 Score second scalloped rectangle 34 of an inch from top, place adhesive above score line, and adhere to card front to create card base.
- 6 Stamp images on cardstock, colour with markers, and die cut.
- 7 Adhere images to card with foam tape.
- 8 Stamp sentiment on cardstock and trim into banner; adhere with foam tape.
- Adhere enamel dots.

INLAID DIE CUTTING



- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Trim panel from cardstock and apply inks; stamp sentiment.
- 3 Die cut plants and pots from cardstock, remove positive pieces, and attach tape to back of outline with sticky side up.
- 4 Die cut plants and pots from cardstock in various colours and piece together in outline.
- 5 Adhere inlaid plants and pots to panel and adhere panel to card base.

DESIGN TIPS:

- Inlaid die cutting is like a puzzle, and puzzles are FUN! Pack your patience with this technique, but you're likely to LOVE the results!
- The QuickStik Precision and Placement Tool from Lifestyle Crafts is super helpful in picking up and placing all of those teeny tiny pieces of the puzzle.

i appreciate you so much

DIE CUT ECLIPSE SENTIMENT

- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Trim panel from cardstock; stamp and emboss background.
- 3 Apply inks with sponge daubers.
- 4 Die cut SMILE from panel. Back panel with cardstock and adhere to card base.
- 5 Adhere die cut letters with foam tape.
- 6 Stamp sentiment on cardstock and die cut into banner; adhere to card.

DESIGN TIPS:

- Look closely! This card says SMILE, but you probably didn't notice that right away. That's what's awesome about creating an eclipse sentiment.
- Make sure to include a secondary sentiment in your design so that the recipient can "find" the full sentiment.
- Simplify this technique with one of your favourite patterned papers.

smile

DIE CUT EXPOSING INSIDE



- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Die cut arch from front panel only; stamp sentiment in lower corner.
- 3 Stamp background on cardstock; die cut into rectangle and adhere inside card.
- 4 Die cut diamond shape from cardstock and adhere to card front.
- 5 Stamp pumpkin on cardstock and die cut; adhere with foam tape.
- 6 Die cut ghosts from cardstock and adhere with foam tape.
- 7 Adhere sequins.

DESIGN TIP: Show the inside of your card with a clever die cut edge or shape. Other takes on this technique are to cut an edge only on the front of the card base or create a window in the card front with a circle or square (or any other shape for that matter!).

hello pumpkin

DIE CUT LAYERING



- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Stamp and emboss background on gold cardstock.
- 3 Die cut rounded rectangle from light grey cardstock and then die cut THANKS from panel; trim piece created in step 2 slightly larger than thanks and adhere behind sentiment with foam tape.
- 4 Die cut circle strip from patterned paper and adhere to rectangle with foam tape; adhere rectangle to card front.
- 5 Die cut leaves from cardstock and adhere (all but one leaf) to card.
- 6 Die cut fox pieces from cardstock, assemble, and adhere with foam tape (making sure to tuck bottom of fox below circular frame).
- Adhere leaf on frame.

DESIGN TIP: When assembling Picture Book dies from Simon Says Stamp, trace the negative cut to create a base for your animal and adhere the pieces on the base.

- 4 Trim around stamped leaves (leaving room to adhere) and adhere behind panel to reveal leaves so that they appear to be set back.
- 5 Stamp and emboss sentiment on vellum; trim and adhere to panel.
- 6 Adhere panel to card base with foam tape.

DESIGN TIPS:

- The setback technique is a fun take on adding depth, but in this case, the images are lower than the panel itself (rather than popping UP the images).
- Vellum can be tricky to adhere, so consider taping it down to the back of the panel before adhering the panel to the card base.

- 5 Trim panel evenly on both sides and colour image.
- 6 Adhere panel to card base with foam tape.

DESIGN TIPS:

- To partially die cut, place only the bottom half of the image on the die cutting platform and only that part between the acrylic plates of the die cut machine. Run through your die cut machine and MAGIC!
- Place washi tape on your shirt a couple of times to deaden the stick so that it won't tear your cardstock.
- **Keep it simple.** A beautiful stamp like this one from Pink & Main doesn't need a lot of extra "noise" to make it really shine!

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

DESIGN TIP: Repeat your embellishments in threes. Three chipboard stickers and three groupings of enamel dots create visual connections in this simple design. Looks for elements to repeat to create a visual triangle (or two!)

photo. If you have a shot you love, enlarge it! I love the size contrast of a large photo, paired with a short journal block and title.



TECHNIQUE TIP

Stacked die cuts

Have you tried stacking your die cuts for titles? This is my favourite technique to add a subtle dimension to a layout or card project. Simply cut multiples of any letter or title element and glue two or more together. I usually glue three or four for the look of a custom chipboard title.





1 Cut multiple letters from cardstock to match your project.



2 Stack and adhere using a strong liquid adhesive.

Capture the colours of fall in a conveniently-sized traveller's notebook! BY SHELLYE MCDANIEL

Autumn is such a fun time of year, filled with rich colours and family adventures.

I love this new take on making a commemorative mini album in a traveller's notebook fashion. And what's even better is that you can make these from the ground up with just a few basic supplies. You're also not limited to size, so make them smaller or make them larger—there are no rules!

MINI SIZE: 5½ x 8½

MAKE IT TIP: Make your cover sturdy.

> If you choose not to add stitching to the cover, reinforce the edges by using high-tack adhesive in addition to the solid adhesive sheet. You can also apply laminate to the cover before stitching.

GETTING STARTED

Fun foam sheets come in an array of colours and some are even glittered on one side. After

cutting the foam sheet down to 8 x 11, select a really fun piece of patterned paper for the cover and cut it to the same size. Use a hightack, permanent adhesive sheet to apply the paper to the smooth side of the foam. Round the edges with a corner punch and machine-stitch around the perimeter if desired.


MAKE IT TIP: Create your own

binding. While there are many patterns online for creating your cording, I simply used a ruler and fine-tip marker. First, find the center (horizontally) of the cover and mark two holes approximately 1/16 inch on the left and right of the center. I do this to the top and bottom of the cover and just above the stitched line. For the vertical hole, you will only need to punch one with either a long-reaching 1/2 inch hole punch or an eyelet setter. Find the center vertically and create a hole.


MAKE IT TIP: Make it interactive. Create a flap with your journaling that hides the photo. Flip it open, and the story is revealed. Making the memories is enjoyable, so make your mini albums a delight as well!



MAKE IT TIP: Type it up and tell it. Using lined patterned paper that mimics an old recipe card, I typed up memories of Thanksgiving celebrations at Papaw and Mamaw Proctor's house. Even if you don't have a photo of the exact celebrations, take a photo of something (like Mamaw's Corelle baking dish) to evoke the memories.



MAKE IT TIP: Add interest with pocket pages. Incorporating 8 x 8 pocket page protectors is another fun element that can showcase smaller photos and even 3 x 4 journal cards. It's touches like this that add more to your beautiful memory keeping.



MAKE IT TIP: Stage some fun photos.

Capture memories with your teenagers in a pile full of leaves out front. They may grumble about raking, but your photo will be a treasure (and you can let them swipe it for their own social media, if you're nice!).
