pocket play

Short on time? Here you'll find creative ideas to make the most of your pocket pages. BY FELICITAS MAYER

I discovered Project Life back in 2012. Coming from traditional scrapbooking, I quickly fell in love with the pocket page format and mostly document in this style these days. I love the simple act of taking the digital photos from my phone's camera roll into a physical album. Most of the time, I like to add some product to my pages because I enjoy the process of creating, but there's no need to embellish the photos in pocket pages.

There's something very meditative about creating watercolour backgrounds or doodling with markers and fine-liners to make my very own patterned papers. I think of it as having the best part of both of my creative worlds: art journaling/ mixed media and documenting via pocket pages.

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TIPS

POCKET TIP #1: Set up formulas you repeat within the project. For example, you can stamp the same sentiment on more than one photo or journaling card or repeat the same card design.

POCKET TIP #2: Create movement with embellishment clusters. These fun collections of products lead the eye around your design.

POCKET TIP #3: Use lists to tell your story. If you're not great at storytelling, use a simple bullet point list to state facts or feelings about the photo subject.

POCKET TIP #1: Incorporate

repetition. Repeating colours or shapes over your whole spread is a simple and effective design element.

POCKET TIP #2: Use

vellum. The filmy nature of vellum can mute too-vibrant backgrounds.

TIP #3: Choose black and white. You can't go wrong with simple black and white stamping—it coordinates with all colours and also adds contrast to most photos.
