





- Add a scalloped "valance" to the top of the design to draw the eye down to the heart of the layout.
- Frame your photo with flowers!

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pocket play

Short on time? Here you'll find creative ideas to make the most of your pocket pages. BY JESS FORSTER

From documenting everyday life moments to recording big celebrations, holidays, or events, pocket pages have been my go-to memory-keeping method for the last 10 years. Why do I love it so much? Simple—it's the versatility of pocket pages! Not only can I create pages with a variety of photos and storytelling techniques, I can also play with colourful products in grid design format. I consider pocket pages to be "designated spaces of possibility" which makes them easy to use. Each pocket presents so many opportunities to grow and get creative.



TIPS

POCKET TIP #1: Enlarge your "best" photo. I chose the cutest photo and enlarged it to 9 x 12. The big picture creates a natural focal point to the page.

POCKET TIP #2: Use an analogous colour scheme. This layout uses yellow, green, and blue tones, and since these colours fall next to each other on the colour wheel, this is considered an analogous colour scheme.

Documenting normal traditions in extraordinary circumstances gives you a visual record of what it looks like to live through history. Although last year's celebrations didn't go as planned because of the pandemic, it was rich with stories. Looking back, I am so happy I took the time to take these photos and write down my thoughts.

easter 2020

TIPS

POCKET TIP #1: Make your pages work for YOU. I paired an older photo with today's perspective in this layout. Using the Fuse tool, I created a horizontal and vertical seam to hold my 6 x 8 photo and two 3 x 4 journaling cards in place. Challenge yourself to come up with your own configurations using this fantastic tool!

POCKET TIP #2: Embellish photos and journaling cards. I added some much needed "lumps and bumps" to my page with the die cut phrase smile and puffy flower stickers. By clustering embellishments with the dots of yellow throughout the page, I've added visual interest and texture.

Mother's Day 2020 was not the norm, so I shared a story about what I was missing most during the pandemic. I paired an older photo of my mom and daughter playing and wrote about the past and included details about what I am looking forward to the most when we can all spend time together again. Scrapbooking can be like therapy and can leave you feeling connected to memories, people, and places, especially when you are not able to be together.



paper patchwork pretties

Patchwork isn't just for quilts anymore. I've noticed this homey and often colourful design trending in fashion and home décor as well as papercrafting. It's such a cozy and cheerful way to add lots of pattern and pizzazz to a design. We called on some of our designers to translate this trend onto scrapbook layouts and cards, and we're pretty sure that you will love the results! BY SUSAN R. OPEL

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design 101 37

DESIGN TIP: The trim at the top of each tag complements the fabric feel of Victoria's patchwork tags.



keep your patchwork focused

Victoria's beautiful double-page spread features six stand-out tags each with an original design. Notice how she built each tag with patterned paper squares. The beauty of this design is how three of the tags have the squares straight and three have the squares with the points up. This really gives the layout variety and interest!

DESIGN TIP: Big tags are a great way to ground

photos on your layouts, so having six across this spread takes your eye across the design.

a good day

This is such an easy way to use up your scraps of patterned paper, too. Die cut a bunch at one time so you have them ready to go for your next layout or card project.

DESIGN TIP: Temper the colourful nature of the patchwork with an otherwise tame and neutral layout to allow the patchwork to shine.



square punch your patchwork


Dig through your patterned paper scraps and dream up a beautiful paper quilt! Nicole used a square punch to evenly line up the background patchwork pattern that appears on the right-hand side of her layout.

DESIGN TIP: Give depth to the patchwork by adding neutral colour and glitter cardstock corners (also made with a paper punch). Nicole stitched over these layers to give them a decidedly patchwork feel.

This patchwork technique is ridiculously simple!

Consider each pocket in your page protectors as a spot to add another pattern. Choose a soft and pretty colour family and layer pattern on pattern to create your patchwork design. Add bits of stitching and soft patterned paper mats to finish the design.

DESIGN TIP: There's something decidedly feminine about the patterns in patchwork designs. Further the theme with lush roses, beautiful butterflies, and pretty script fonts.

walk in kew gardens

DESIGN TIP: Highlight a vertical scene with a long and lean photo that

Instead of square patches, make a patchwork with patterned paper strips in the same width; die cut them on an angle to give the design lots of energy. Layer the patchwork panel on a coordinating patterned paper fancy bracket panel for extra charm and coziness.

DESIGN TIP: Latisha's card subtly calls to mind a traditional baby motif: the baby blanket. The patchwork almost feels like an actual handmade quilt that one might wrap around a sweet baby girl!

This clean and elegant design might not appear to fit our theme at first glance, but take a closer look. Latisha layered intricate die cut squares in gorgeous white for a beautiful and chic lacy patchwork design. The pops of lavender in the delicate florals and the perimeter expertly showcase the sophisticated patchwork design.

DESIGN TIP: Layer die cuts in the same colour to create a lovely monochromatic depth to your card.

elegant hello





In place of the flowers in the PageMap, she scattered beautiful fussy cut butterflies all over the layout. Did you see the one at the bottom left of the layout? It's an unexpected touch and brings such movement to Dawn's design.

PageMap will be one you will refer to again and again.







This precision pick up and placement tool helps you handle small, hard-to-pick-up things like beads, buttons, die cut pieces, and other small items. It also works like a dream for detailed inlaid die cutting.

PRODUCT TIP: In addition to the pick-up end, this tool includes a poker to help dislodge die cut pieces and allows you to scoot and shift tiny objects more precisely.





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design 101

Let's study the hows and whys that separate just okay design from great design! BY SUSAN R. OPEL

Want to know why it works when a design comes together? Delve into the minds of two designers and their creative processes and learn some fantastic rules for making your next layout a phenomenal success!

layout 1

Create a visual triangle. The circle embellishments • mark the vertices of a visual triangle. Everything inside the triangle becomes the focal point of the page.

Offset your images away from center.

This design choice conveys movement.

Anchor your • design. Use paper strips of different widths to anchor your images to the background.

Use colour for your background.

Choosing a colourful background complements all the patterns and provides some needed negative space as well.

Incorporate texture and dimension

Combine foam and cardstock stickers to create your title. Varying the size, texture, and dimension of your title words adds interest and fun.

Give direction. Use embellishments to emphasize the importance of elements in the page. The small arrow next to the journaling spot directs the viewer's attention to the story.

Add a subtitle. The small die cut helps to tell the story, but it also serves as a resting point for the viewer.

Start with product. There are so many ways to approach a layout. If a certain product speaks to you, start there and see where your creativity takes you!

Make it coordinate.

Choose photos that match the products you are using to help tie the whole page together.

layout 2

Create balance.

By adding a smaller cluster in the opposite corner of your largest cluster, you give your layout a sense of balance.

Use a bold background. By using a patterned paper with a large pattern or image, you have less space to fill and an amazing focal point.



BIG DESIGN TIP: Divide and conquer. Imagine your 12 x 12 page is four equal parts. Add the bulk of your content to one quadrant, and simply add accents to the opposing corner. This is a very pleasing and also asymmetrical format!

Give a handmade touch.

Create texture and interest by adding some machine stitching around shapes on the page.

OUR FOCUS: CREATING MAGIC WITH STENCILS


The key to creating with stencils is to have fun and experiment! We asked five talented designers to come up with their most creative and inspiring ideas for making stencil magic. Let's take a look at what they've come up with, and prepare to be inspired by a myriad of ways to have a blast with stencils!

FLOCKING

STEP-BY-STEP

- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Trim green cardstock panel; spritz back of stencil with Pixie Spray and adhere to panel.
- 3 Coat stencil with transfer gel, smooth across with stencil tool, and pull back stencil. Let panel dry completely.
- 4 Trim flock transfer paper in nine colours, place over tacky dots in diagonal rows.
- 5 Place panel in parchment paper and run through preheated laminator; carefully peel flock paper away.
- 6 Die cut leaves and bug pieces from various colours of cardstock, adhere together, and adhere to panel with foam tape.
- Stamp sentiment with black ink on white cardstock, colour with markers, and die cut with coordinating die.
- 8 Adhere panel to card base with foam tape and tie on twine bow.

INK BLENDING



STEP-BY-STEP

- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Trim cardstock panel; blend blue ink toward center.
- 3 Blend ink through stencil on cardstock, use orange marker for floral centers, and die cut with coordinating dies.
- 4 Adhere flowers and foliage to panel with foam tape and splatter with black and white paint.
- 5 Stamp and emboss sentiment and adhere to panel; adhere panel to card base.

DESIGN TIPS:

- Invest in ink blending tools that can be reserved for separate colour families to avoid colour mixing.
- When blending ink on this card, go darker on the edges and lighter toward the center. It makes the flowers almost look like they are glowing!

STEP-BY-STEP

- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Blend light ink through tulips stencil on cardstock; blend darker ink through tulip detail stencil to create second layer.
- 3 Repeat step two with tulip leaves and blend extra green ink around leaves.
- 4 Blend blue ink (darker toward the edges) to create sky.
- 5 Trim stenciled scene into rectangle and splatter with black and white paint.
- 6 Stamp and emboss sentiment and adhere to panel.
- Layer craft foam rectangle behind panel and adhere panel to card base.

DESIGN TIP:

• Many companies offer stencils that help you layer images with two to four separate stencils. Still a great price point and amazing results!

- 2 With stencil, blend hearts on cardstock with dark pink ink. Clean stencil, shift position to overlap stenciled hearts, and blend lighter pink.
- 3 Trim stenciled hearts into panel and mat with white cardstock.
- 4 Stamp and emboss sentiment on black cardstock, die cut into circle, and adhere to panel with foam squares.
- 6 Adhere panel to card base.

DESIGN TIPS:

- This technique would work well with ANY stencil. Who wants to try this out right now? *hand raised*
- Add sophistication to a girlie pink design with a stark black and white sentiment.

- 4 Die cut sentiment from light pink cardstock and shadow from black; adhere together and adhere to card front.
- 5 Stamp and emboss sentiment, trim into banner, and adhere to panel with foam tape.

DESIGN TIP:

• Dry embossing is a fun way to get the most out of your stencils. Check out your manual die cut machine's sandwich for dry embossing with a stencil.

- 4 Mask circle off and blend blue ink for background.
- 5 Remove masks one at a time carefully blending each area, one colour at a time.
- 6 Die cut sentiment and adhere to panel with liquid adhesive.
- Adhere panel to card front and adhere sequins.

DESIGN TIP:


• You can use masking paper, computer paper, or wide swaths of low-tack tape to mask a stencil.

STEP-BY-STEP

- 1 Make card from cardstock. Trim patterned paper panel and adhere to card front.
- 2 Attach stencil to cardstock and on workspace.
- 3 Blend distress inks over stencil, apply transparent gloss over flowers, and use stencil tool to spread gloss evenly.
- 4 Remove stencil, sprinkle glitter on wet paste, and shake off excess. Let dry and pause to clean stencil and knife immediately.
- 5 Trim panel to card front size.
- 6 Die cut sentiment from white cardstock and shadow from black, adhere together, and adhere to card front; adhere sub-sentiment to panel.
- O Adhere panel to card front with foam tape.

DESIGN TIPS:

- Pixie Spray from Therm O Web is a must-have for perfect results with stencils.
- If glitter sticks, what else will? Experiment with beads and tiny sequins and see what happens!

- Make card from cardstock; adhere strip of patterned paper to top edge, rip another patterned paper strip, adhere to panel, and machine stitch bottom edge. Set aside.
- On white cardstock apply transfer gel through stencil on top ¾ only. Let dry for at least an hour.
- 2 Cover stenciled portion with foil and run through preheated laminator. Remove foil to reveal design.
- 3 Lightly blend in light pink over foiled area, add droplets of water to ink, and dab with paper towel.
- 4 Trim stenciled panel, tie on bow, and adhere panel to card base below stitched strip.
- Stamp sentiment onto tag in ombré effect and adhere enamel heart.
- 6 Attach tag to ribbon with pins and adhere gems.

• Transfer gel will appear clear rather than white when completely dry.

- 2 On white cardstock apply teal glitter gel through stencil on bottom half, apply iridescent glitter gel to top half, and carefully blend an ombré look with stencil tool. Let dry for at least an hour.
- 3 Trim cardstock panel, lightly blend light pink on left edge, add droplets of water to ink, and dab with paper towel.
- 4 Rip strip of patterned paper and adhere along left edge of inked panel and machine stitch.
- 6 Once stenciled panel is dry, trim and adhere to cardstock panel.
- 6 Stamp sentiment on vellum, trim to a pennant shape, and mat with patterned paper pennant. Stitch pennants together and adhere to panel with foam tape.
- Fussy cut some florals from patterned paper and adhere; add clip and adhere gems and pearls.



I love to have lists of goals to inspire me! I decided to document a few things I'm hoping to do or try in the current year. Lists like these can be so fun to create. Some are work related. Some are home related. And some are personal goals. Plus, I tossed in a quick selfie to document me, right now, in the current year. It'll be fun to check back at year's end to see where I am with these ideas.

DESIGN TIP: Grids are so solid.

A grid of goals? Yes, please! I love this simple set up. You could also use a square punch to create several grids in different colours and hand-write those goals for your layout. Don't forget that picture of you!

DESIGN TIP: Mix and match.

A coordinated collection of patterned papers makes choosing and mixing patterns a breeze!

STORY TIP: Repeat those leadins! Starting your sentence with the same phrase is a fun way to create a journaling list. Plus, it helps propel your writing! Brainstorm a list of things you're hopeful for today, and then download my free cut file for your next layout.

DESIGN TIP: Repeat

yourself! Look for ways to reinforce your design by repeating elements. Here I have repeated flower stickers that coordinate with my patterned paper. I also repeated a simple notched corner at the top and bottom on the left side of the inner mat. These small details really pull a design together.

DESIGN TIP: Be bold! Bold the first few words of any journal block to add visual contrast. This creates separation and invites the reader into the experience.

FOCUS ON THE GOOD What are your current hopes?

I will never tire of focusing on the positive and these thoughts deserve a place in my albums. Cultivating positivity through scrapbooking is a very life-affirming way to craft, don't you think?

GETTING STARTED

Don't get caught up in standards or rules.

Start creating right away no matter the number of supplies you have or techniques you may know. With some imagination and a bit of fun, you'll be surprised at what you can create. Think back to when you were a kid and you built forts and had fun without a lot of stuff. The same holds true for mini albums. Come up with a plan and figure out how to make it a reality!

- MAKE IT TIP: Reuse and recycle. Look around your home for boxes or objects you can alter into mini albums. My mini album box is recycled—I made it out of a box of chocolate bars!
- MAKE IT TIP: Make it special. Mini albums are one-of-a-kind gifts for family and friends. Make a coordinated gift box for your mini album. Not only will it make the gift unique, but the box is also a great way to store the album.
- MAKE IT TIP: Experiment with placement. Make the cover visually attractive by playing around with colour, bold titles, or

embellishments until you come up with a pleasing result!

MAKE IT TIP: Mix techniques and styles.

I love trying different bindings or page designs. I used an accordion group of pages on one side and a banner tag style binding on the other side.

MAKE IT TIP: Add in pockets. Pockets are another fun way to add interest to mini albums. They can hold journaling, souvenirs, or even more photos!





MAKE IT TIP: Add texture and interaction.

Ribbons and rings add dimension, texture, and interaction to your album. Think about how you can keep the attention of anyone looking at your album!

MAKE IT TIP: Pour on the product. Ever find a product that you just love so much? Find creative ways to use it in your mini albums. Since the albums aren't flat, it doesn't matter how bulky they turn out!


