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

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
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

BECKI'S DESIGN TIPS: Frame with florals!


- Flank a focal photo with scads of die cut shapes and stickers to create a beautiful frame.

• Sometimes a two-page layout can seem overwhelming because there's so much real estate to cover. Try using oversized tags as individual "canvases." Fill up each tag, line them up across two pages, and you'll be surprised how quickly that blank space fills up!

pocket play

Short on time? Here you'll find creative ideas to make the most of your pocket pages. BY ELIZABETH HEINZ

Pocket pages can be so much fun. Although I've consistently done pocket page albums since 2014, a LOT has changed. In the beginning (from 2014 to 2019) I followed a weekly format, but in 2020, I switched to a monthly format. I needed a break, and as my boys matured, I was taking fewer photos. That simple change was exactly what I needed to renew my love for this form of memory keeping.



TIPS

POCKET TIP #1: Go BIG. Pocket page photos don't have to be 3×4 or 4×6 . Enlarge beautiful and/or meaningful photos to give them lots of attention.

POCKET TIP #2: Use a story lens. My journaling for this layout was made easy by coming up with a lens or focus for my journaling. The five senses were the perfect way to document the things I enjoy about fall.

POCKET TIP #3: Get yourself in your pages. Make it a point to hand off the camera or take a selfie to make sure that your story is being told.

Be flexible and create variety. I typically start and end my monthly spreads with a 9 x 12 pocket page that I call my "bookends." Then, I add inserts in a wide variety of sizes. I look at my photos for the month and make decisions based on the stories I want to tell. I love that it allows me to include special occasions and longer stories, too.

TIPS

POCKET TIP #1: Combine past and present photos to show the passage of time. If I want to use an old or poor-quality photo, I often convert it to black and white as that format tends to be more forgiving.

POCKET TIP #2: Make the most of space. I like to use flip-ups to include longer journaling, private thoughts, or additional photos to my pocket page spreads.

POCKET TIP #3: Look for quote cards that speak to your theme.

I loved using a quote card for this spread as it was perfectly appropriate for the topic. Plus, the pop of solid colour adds to the design.

Speak from the heart. For this layout, my journaling is a letter to my son upon the major milestone of receiving a Bachelor's degree. We are so proud of his work ethic, friendships, amazing accomplishments, and kindness.



STORY TIP: Flip-ups are a great way to

keep your message or journaling a bit more private, as well!





We love the clean white section that gives the eye a place to rest, and notice how she also cut some leaves out of white cardstock and layered them with patterned leaves for subtle texture following the lead of the embellishment cluster in the PageMap.

DESIGN TIP: Face your subjects in.

Note how Virginia's subject is facing the title and the journaling. It's a small but effective way to create a design.







JESSICA'S TIPS AND TRICKS


- Work with a larger piece of synthetic paper than your intended finished project size. Doing this gives you the opportunity to pick what part of the panel you'd like to use for your background.
- Use the leftover scraps for die cutting, colourful strips, etc.
- Cover up sticky areas of alcohol ink with foil for a little extra shine!
- A little goes a long way—you only need a drop or two of ink to cover a large area.
- Work slowly and don't rush the process.
- Don't be afraid to blend unusual colours together. You might just end up with a new favourite colour.
- Create lots of texture with splatters of alcohol or alcohol ink when you're done. This also goes a long way in covering up areas you might not like as much as others.
- Use a low heat tool to manipulate the ink pushing and pulling it on the panel to create lines of colour.
- Don't be afraid to tilt your paper, turn it around, and look at it from different angles.
- Allow your ink to be more concentrated in some areas and more diluted in others for even more interest.

MINDY'S TIPS AND TRICKS

- Work in a well-ventilated area or wear a mask.
- Gilded Alloy works best with an alcohol blending solution.
- To help spread the ink, use an air blower.
- To achieve more vibrant colours, use a blending solution.
- To get more movement, use rubbing alcohol. This will result in less vibrant colours.
- Work on a glass surface for easy clean up.
- Wear gloves to protect your fingers.
- Once alcohol ink is dry, spritz rubbing alcohol for a fun splatter effect.
- Never put blending solution in a spritz bottle.
- Come prepared! Have lots of synthetic paper panels ready because once you start, it's too fun to stop!

design 101

Let's study the hows and whys that separate just okay design from great design! BY SUSAN R. OPEL

Want to know why it works when a design comes together? Delve into the minds of three designers and their creative processes and learn some fantastic rules for making your next design a phenomenal success!

layout 1

Select items that colour coordinate

rather than contrast with the background when arranging embellishments on a colourful background.

Mat your photos.

When using a busy/colourful background, help your photos stand out by matting them on a simple paper (or solid cardstock) like Lisa did with the white grid pattern.



Stamp a border to

reinforce the focal point. Lisa used a sunburst stamp to create a scalloped edge for her photo mat.

Position your largest elements on the page first

and then use small accents to fill in the gaps.

 Maintain equal margins when positioning photos in a grid so they visually appear as a single unit.

BIG DESIGN TIP: Connect

corner to corner. Draw the eye through the design diagonally by creating embellishment clusters in opposite corners of the page. The corner clusters serve to frame the entire design.

Create a cohesive title

block by layering two different fonts atop a tag.

Frame the layout Add a frame around the layout to create a margin. This finishes the layout and draws the eye in.

Add texture to the layout with details in more than one area using your sewing machine. Layering the embellishments also adds texture.

Create a visual triangle with the title and embellishment clusters to draw the eye from one point to the next on the layout.



BIG DESIGN TIP: Allow the

eye to rest. When using lots of patterned paper, use white space to allow the eye to rest. Make sure the white space isn't trapped: keep all the busy details tight together with the white space around the edges.

u-pick pumpkins

them down and walk away!

Play with colour. Add maroon and peach leaves to give your design an even more warm, fall-like vibe.

Mix different sized die cuts to create a backdrop for the focal point—adding complementary coloured leaves behind the sunflower to create fullness.

Add extra touches to die cuts with a white gel pen.



Use textured paper or detailed dies to create a realistic, natural background.

Give textured elements shadow and depth by blending a neutral colour over them.

Create a realistic water drop effect by adding clear embellishments to the petals.



SWITCH UP THE SEASONS


STEP-BY-STEP

- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Trim white cardstock panel, emboss dots, and adhere to card base.
- 3 Die cut mailbox pieces from blue cardstock and mailbox handle and hearts from metallic gold cardstock. Hot foil sentiment on mailbox front and assemble mailbox. Adhere to card with foam tape.
- Stamp envelope on white cardstock with blue ink, trim, and adhere to bouquet.

DESIGN TIPS:

- Latisha used Christmas and Valentine's Day die sets to make a non-holiday card. Check out your die stash and see where your creativity takes you.
- Pretend you're creating a floral bouquet. Larger dies go in the back and greenery dies should be mixed throughout the stems and florals.

DRY EMBOSS WITH A DIE CUT



STEP-BY-STEP

- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Trim white cardstock panel and lightly blend ink colours as shown; use die cut plate to dry emboss panel.
- 3 Blend more ink over raised areas of embossed panel, trim into rectangle, and mat with white cardstock.
- 4 Stamp and emboss sentiment, die cut with coordinating die, and adhere to panel with foam tape.
- 5 Adhere panel to card base and adhere sequins.

DESIGN TIPS:

- Not sure about the proper sandwich for using a die cut to dry emboss? Check the website of your manual die cut machine!
- Instead of an entire panel, choose any die cut like a flower or leaf to dry emboss as a textural focal point.

STEP-BY-STEP

- Make card from cardstock. Trim panel from brown cardstock and adhere to card base.
- 2 Trim panel from white cardstock; dry emboss leaves and acorns on entire panel.
- 3 Blend purple, red, orange, and yellow ink over embossed panel.
- 4 Die cut thanks from brown cardstock three times. Adhere together and to inked panel.
- 5 Stamp and emboss sentiment on brown cardstock and adhere with foam tape; affix gems.
- 6 Adhere panel to card base.

DESIGN TIPS:

- Use a low-tack tape like Therm O Web's pink Pixie Tape to ensure that your dies don't slip when you dry emboss them.
- Let the embossed background shine with a beautiful ink blend and not much more!

When Lisa's best friend Alison got married, it wasn't a typical wedding celebration for Lisa. Not only did Lisa's BFF get married, but also, they became sisters-inlaw. Alison married Lisa's brotherin-law and became part of the family. How cool is that?

DESIGN TIP: Frame with embellishments. Lisa expertly used ephemera to create a lovely frame for this special photo that includes Lisa's daughter.

STORY TIP: Tuck in a tag. Lisa told the story on a tag tucked behind the single photo. What a clever and interactive idea!

FOCUS ON THE SUBJECT

DESIGN TIP: Use open space on photos. Lisa placed part of the title over a non-essential area on the photo. Try to incorporate open space when taking pictures. It's okay to have your subject be off center. In fact, it creates a very engaging, dynamic image!

DESIGN TIP: Face it in. Make sure to have your photo subject facing INTO the design, and not away from it. This helps the viewer's eye follow a natural progression across the page.

DESIGN TIP: Grids are good. Lisa's gorgeous gatherings on her circle grid create a lovely counterbalance to the large photo. Grids aren't just for photos! Play with your ephemera and see what shakes out!



with chipboard pieces. Some of the fun of making a mini album is the actual process of creating your own album. This makes your album oneof-a-kind!


MAKE IT TIP: Vary your page sizes.


