GETTING STARTED

When binding your own album, decide on a binding system right away. This will dictate the size of your mini and get you headed down the right track!

MAKE IT TIP: Choose a theme. Carry one or two elements throughout your album for cohesiveness. In my mini album I focused on a rainbow theme and added lots of gold with sewing, paint, glitter, embellishments, and a chain stitched border on each page.

MAKE IT TIP: Narrow it down. Pick a focused topic to keep from getting overwhelmed.

MAKE IT TIP: Go easy on yourself. Not every page needs a photo! Sometimes it's just fun creating

something pretty.

Add depth and details. Grand electronic cut files work well in this size album and the carefully chosen patterned papers paired with stitching make this album extra special!

MAKE IT TIP: Include

pockets. Pockets are a great place to save even more photos and cute journaling cards.
