# Creating withs を G ES BONUS SKETCH OPTIONS 

A visual example of the many adaptations you can make to help the sketch better fit your needs.

## ORIGINAL SKETCH



Use straight strips in place of the angled strips.

## OPTION \#3

Simplify by using a straight rectangle piece.


OPTION \#5
Simplify by using a single angled piece in place of the strips.

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The following examples show different ways you can adapt the papers on the sketch to either simplify or enhance the design.

## OPTION \#2

Simplify by using two larger slanted pieces together.

## OPTION \#4

Use slanted strips to create a retangle background.


Use a different shape like squares, diamonds, or hexagons in place of the strips.


## OPTION \#7

Rotate the sketch.


## changingth:PHOTOS

The following examples show different photo sizes that can work with this two photo sketch design without changing the number of photos.

## OPTION \#9

Use two larger photos like $3 x$ $5^{\prime \prime}$ or $4 \times 6^{\prime \prime}$.


## OPTION \#10

Use two smaller photos like $2-1 / 2 \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ or $3 \times 3$ ".


Use one larger photo in place of the two photos.


## adding more

The following examples show how to adjust the sketch to work with more photos, most often by extending or using smaller photos.

## OPTION \#14

Use two $3 \times 2$ " photos in place of the $3 \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ photo.

## OPTION \#16

Use three smaller photos.


OPTION \#24 - Add a large photo block on the opposite page.


OPTION \#24 - Rotate the sketch and add a large photo block on the opposite page.

## OPTION \#15

Add a small accent photo.


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The following examples show how to adjust the one-page sketch to work as a two-page design using a variety of methods.


OPTION \#25-Extend the background strips across both pages and add a large photo block.


OPTION \#25 - Shrink the slanted strips design down and add a photo block that lines up with the edges of it.
