Let's get ready for some creative fun with fabulous cut files and patterned papers! BY PAIGE EVANS

Hello, friends! It's Paige Evans back with my favourite ideas for making eye-catching and colourful pages and projects!



PAIGE'S PROCESS FOR **BACKING CUT FILES:**

- Use inner pieces from cut file to trace on back of patterned paper.
- Tracing on the back eliminates the need to erase pencil marks.
- Leave 1/8-inch margin to adhere to back of cut file.
- Adhere with fine-tipped liquid glue.

PAIGE POINTER: There are literally hundreds of thousands of cut files out there. I have designed nearly 4000, and they can be found in my shop, Etsy, the Silhouette Design Store, and many even on the SCT website! I also offer a free weekly cut file in my Happy Scrappy Place Facebook Group if you want to give some a try before taking the purchase plunge!

THE FOCUS:

Backing a cut file with patterned paper is the focus of this issue.

PAIGE POINTER: What exactly is a cut

file? It's a digital image that can be cut with an electronic cutting machine such as a Cricut or Cameo and then used on your scrapbook pages or paper projects as an embellishment. I mostly cut images from white textured cardstock by American Crafts or patterned paper that coordinates with my idea for the page.
