

BONUS SKETCH OPTIONS


A visual example of the many adaptations you can make to help the sketch better fit your needs.




ORIGINAL SKETCH

changing the PAPERS


The following examples show different ways you can adapt the papers on the sketch to either simplify or enhance the design.




OPTION #1 - Simplify by using one large background piece in place of the vertical strips.




OPTION #2 - Use different sizes of horizontal strips. Use all the same size or mix it up with a variety of sizes.



OPTION #3 - Use horizontal strips in place of the vertical strips.




OPTION #4 - Use a themed element in place of the strips. Try birthday candles, flowers w/ stems, or pencils/crayons.




OPTION #5 - Use a different shape in place of the strips. Try hexagons, circles, squares, or triangles.

changing the PHOTOS

The following examples show different photo sizes that can work with this two-photo sketch design without changing the number of photos.



OPTION #6 - Use 3 x 5" photos in place of the 3-1/2 x 5" photos and adjust the background to fit. Use a 7 x 5" photo.




OPTION #7 - Use 3-1/2 x 3-1/2" square photos in place of the 3-1/2 x 5" photos.



OPTION #8 - Use smaller photos like 3 x 4-1/2" with a 3-1/2 x 5" photo mat.

using less PHOTOS

The following examples show how to adjust the sketch to work with less photos, most often by removing photos or using larger photos.




OPTION #9 - Use a 7 x 5" photo in place of two 3-1/2 x 5" photos.




OPTION #10 - Replace a photo with a larger journaling block.

adding more PHOTOS


The following examples show how to adjust the sketch to work with more photos, most often by extending or using smaller photos.



OPTION #11 - Use two 3-1/2 x 2-1/2" photos in place of one or more 3-1/2 x 5" photo.



OPTION #12 - Use two 3-1/2 x 5" photos in place of the 6 x 4" photo and 7 x 5" mat.




OPTION #13 - Extend the height of the photo block to include more photos.

changing the SIZE

The following examples show how to adjust the two-page sketch to work as a one-page design using a variety of methods.


OPTION #14

Reduce the design details down to fit on a one-page layout.




OPTION #15

Use a combination of elements from both pages.



OPTION #16

Use the vertical strips and embellishments as inspiration.
