





#### Celebrate fall fun with a festive mini album.

This issue's column is brought to you by the letter F—as in fall, festivals, family, and fun! There's no shortage of fun this time of year, and you'll certainly want to document it. Here's a shortcut: maximize the mini! A single mini album containing a page for each adventure will save time and keep all of your adventures together in one fall-infused project.



**DESIGN TIP: Make a mini** your own with handpainted watercolour touches. Sure, it may seem intimidating, but watercolour paint is user friendly and an awesome doodling medium.

PIC TIP: Capture the excitement of a funfilled experience by including action shots.

PIC TIP: Much fall fun is had after the sun goes down which can be hard on those photos, but poorly lit pics aren't a lost cause. Instead, have fun exaggerating the look and adding whimsy using photo filters on your phone. I edited these dark shots in an app called PicTapGo.

PIC TIP: Shooting my tiny kiddos next to their pumpkin patch picks is an awesome way to illustrate scale and magnify just how young they are.


PIC TIP: Let your camera's zoom help you capture a place you visit year after year in a fresh way. Close-up shots are sometimes all you need and will make a repetitive story feel unique.

#### TRY THIS! WATERCOLOUR TRICKS

Here are a few tricks for using watercolour on your next project:

- Less is more. When illustrating icons and setting a scene, don't agonize over every detail. Instead, keep your art simple.
- Stick with watercolour paper it won't warp when wet.
- Start with a pencil sketch. Simply erase any markings when your page has dried.
- Don't be bashful with the water. Add plenty to your paint palette—it allows the paint to spread better and creates a softer finish. Less water is great for adding shading and finer details.
- Once dry, use a fine-point pen to add detail. I used a .01 black Micron pen.
- Add splatter. Dip a wet brush into wet paint, hold that brush over your work, and tap it to splash color droplets. Splatter is an easy way to make your watercoloured images feel more finished and interesting.

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# pocket play

Short on time? Get creative ideas to make the most of your pocket pages. By CANDACE PERKINS

I love creating pocket pages, and there's nothing I love more than **looking through past creations.** I love that all our "little" family moments are documented on these pages—the everyday moments that I would forget if they weren't captured in my pocket albums.



TIPS

POCKET TIP #1: Create a visual triangle with your embellishments. By creating a visual triangle with the round cork stickers, it forces the eye to move around the page looking for similar embellishments.

POCKET TIP #2: Use embellishments to spark journaling. Look through your stash of embellishments and find items that spark your stories for the week.

POCKET TIP #3: Use numbers to streamline journaling. To quickly document items in your photos or spread, use numbers and coordinate the numbers within your journaling.

Busy weeks call for lots of photos! In the pocket adjacent to the title of this layout, I wanted to document four things to have handy come winter. So I printed tiny photos, numbered them, and adhered them to one card. By printing them each with a white border, there's a unity to the photos, and the white space between them allows the eye to rest. Below I added journaling about each of these cold weather favourites with the

**DESIGN TIP: Limit your** colour palette. Using just two colours—pink and green—creates a very restful, elegant feel to this page. Sometimes less can be more with colour!

**DESIGN TIP: Include** white space. Not every pocket needs to be filled with content that is busy. Including white or open space on cards lends a bit of visual rest to any pocket page design.

I have a whole slew of boys in my life, but I love pink! The floral quote journaling card allowed me to document our story and add in pretty pink floral touches, but the geometric green pattern in the middle pocket still keeps it masculine enough for my guys.

#### TIPS

POCKET TIP #1: Go big! Choose a letter or number that symbolizes something in your spread and make that a large focal point on the spread.

POCKET TIP #2: Create dimension. Just because you are working within pocket pages doesn't mean you can't add a little dimension. Using a thick, chipboard number creates interest and separation between the base of your spread and the embellishments allowing the eye to settle on the spotlighted embellishments.

POCKET TIP #3: Use black and white photos. By using black and white photos you can make any photos match the product that you want to use.

# mixed media made easy

Terrific techniques to try using reactive tissue paper.

BY VICKI BOUTIN

It's time to channel your inner preschooler and play with a technique that I first dabbled with in my early school years. Let's explore the magic of reactive or bleeding tissue paper! This cheap and cheerful craft medium is a tissue paper full of pigment that reacts with water.

#### **ABOUT REACTIVE** TISSUE PAPER

#### Don't use this tissue paper in your kids' birthday gifts!


Reactive Tissue Paper is highly pigmented for mixed media projects with serious moxie. Crumple it, mist it, pounce with it, let it sit, and watch the colour transfer create a unique pattern. Things may get a little messy, but messy is fun!

#### **DESIGN TIP:**

Handwritten journaling adds the perfect touch to the artsy background created with reactive tissue paper.

#### TECHNIQUE TIP: Re-misting the tissue

shapes once they are on the moistened paper causes the ink to "bleed."

TECHNIQUE TIP: The longer the shapes are left in water, the more pigment will release resulting in richer colours.





2 Mist paper with water, place tissue leaves on paper, and mist again. Allow leaves to sit for a while.



3 Use a heat gun to remove the tissue leaves and reveal the pattern. Set aside tissue leaves for later use.

**TECHNIQUE TIP: Layer tissue and spritz with** water to create colourful patterns on your leaves giving them a more mottled and natural look. Use a heat gun to prevent tearing the tissue when removing them from one another.



**TECHNIQUE TIP: The leaves on this card are** the same ones I used on the layout. I laid them on top of one another, transferred a little color with the help of water, and BAM! It's a total two-in-one kind of technique!

# design school: repetition

Do you ever wish you had a magical formula to a create a stellar finished product? Following the rules of design can make the process a bit easier. Using repetition is an easy way to create balance. Repetition in design is glue—it holds designs together and gives them purpose. You'll want to jot down these superb ideas for using repetition in your layouts and cards! BY SUSAN R. OPEL

#### layout no. 1



#### repeat photo placement

#### Use the same size of photos for your double page

layout and place each photo in the same place on different patterned papers. You'll note that Virginia's photos feel like they are marching across the page as your eye is drawn to each large vertical rectangle. This design is great for adding cute embellishments and journaling to tell the story. Keep it even more linear by placing the photos in a straight line.

#### repeat an image

Stamp the same image multiple times at the same angle and in the same colour, and then stamp one in a different colour to make it stand out. You'll note that Veronica stamped a second orange leaf, die cut it, and added twine to make it the focal point of her card.

#### repeat an embellishment

Paige repeated pretty bows for a fun and whimsical look on her colourful layout. Take a look at the cow in the image—it has repeated images on it, too! Paige grounded each bow with stitching which makes the bows feel more stable. Perhaps you have some fun embellishments in multiples that would work well for this technique, or you could create your own like Paige did with a punch and patterned paper.

#### repeat a critter

Have you ever been commissioned to make a birthday card for someone at the office or from a whole family? Use masking to create a crowd of critters! You can add fun details like bow ties and glasses to customize your gang.

DESIGN TIP: When masking, always stamp the image that you want to be in front first. By masking the other images, they will appear as if they are behind the image in the foreground.

**DESIGN TIP: Masking always looks** messy until you peel away the masks. Then BEHOLD the magic!

#### sending a smile

#### MAKE A CROWD WITH MASKING

Try your hand at masking one image several times on your next layout or card by following these steps:



• Stamp balloons on cardstock. Stamp again on repositionable paper and trim around the edges to create a mask. Place mask on the original stamped image.



2 Stamp the fox at the top of the balloon cluster with the mask covering the balloons. NOTE: A stamp positioner tool, such as the MISTI, helps with precision placement of your stamps.



3 Create a mask for the fox following the instructions in Step 1. Place mask over the fox and stamp a new fox right next to his pal. Repeat for additional foxes. Remove masks when done.

#### layout no. 3



#### repeat similar photos

When you've taken several photos at once and they're all slightly different, it can be fun to use them all on a page together. By using these three repeated images, they carry your eye horizontally across the page to the journaling.

#### DESIGN TIP: Instead of pulling out a border punch or your die cut machine,

look for patterns in paper that you can hand-cut to achieve an interesting edge like Meghann did with this teal diamond pattern.

#### repeat journaling spots

#### Place your journaling on a series of tags.

By varying the colour and shape slightly, you can achieve repetition with visual interest which will draw the eye to the journaling—one of the most important parts of your scrapbook layouts!

#### repeat shapes

Look closely at Kelly's layout, and you'll find she has repeated stars and circles. Let's take a trip around her layout starting with the circle and star above the title. Now let your eyes travel to the circles and stars at the bottom of the large photo and then to the circles and stars to the right of the journaling. If you were to draw a line from one to the other and back again, you can see these repeated shapes create a visual triangle. Masterful!

DESIGN TIP: Kelly's visual triangle is well thought out—each star and circle cluster highlights the three most important parts of any scrapbook layout: title, photos, and journaling. Visual triangles instantly add connection and energy to a design.

#### MORE IDEAS FOR USING REPETITION

repeat photos in a grid

Kelly creates repetition in the photo grid she used on the right-hand side of her layout. With two smaller photos at the top and a larger one beneath it, she

- Repetition in journaling. Use a recurring phrase like, "I want to remember..." That repetition can add a comfortable cadence and meaningful repetition to your journaling.
- Repetition of colour. Create harmony and balance in your designs with repetition of colours.
- Repetition of type. Coordinate the fonts used in your journaling and title to add repetition and stability to a design. Trying to incorporate too many fonts can muddle the storytelling.
- Same thing different colours. If you love butterflies or circles or stars, punch, stamp, or die several of them in a variety of colours. Place them in a grid, and you've got repetition magic!
- Group things in threes. Add sequins or embellishments in three spots on your design to add movement.
- Repetition of patterns. Find patterned papers with the same pattern and use that pattern throughout your design.



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

Mini albums offer the ease of having all of your photos, thoughts, and memories for one occasion in one place, making them ideal for busy scrapbookers (a.k.a. YOU). Plus, creating a coordinating album with similar products and styles is fun, and you can change your style from album to album to suit your needs. They really are my favourite way to scrapbook!



#### fall family

MINI SIZE:

6 x 8

- Inside an open antique suitcase.
- In a wire basket on a coffee table.
- Placed on a bookshelf like a crafty bookend.
- Stacked in a fabric basket inside the kids' playroom.

#### **GETTING STARTED**

When it's time to start creating a mini album, I usually ask myself where I want to display my album. The best part of mini albums is sharing them with others, so displaying the album in a way that is easy to access is important. Once I've made that decision, I have a better idea of the size and style of album I want to make.

- MAKE IT TIP: For consistency's sake and ease, print all of your photos in one size. My mini albums always highlight photos that are 4 x 6 or smaller.
- MAKE IT TIP: Wrap it up (literally) with some pretty ribbon or twine to hold it together. This makes it simple to re-open time and time again!



MAKE IT TIP: Use one collection to help things flow. Most collections include an assortment of patterns and colours, so if your family has boys AND girls you can usually find a more masculine paper to use. B sides are key!

MAKE IT TIP: Add texture with your embellishments. Mini albums are meant to be shared and touched, so pull out all the stops.



MAKE IT TIP: Use a ring. One of the best things about mini albums is that there are no rules. This album consists of chunky pages that are held together by a ring that allows you to add, subtract, or pull out each page to your heart's content. That freedom allows you to wrap a big bow around one page if that's what you want to do!



MAKE IT TIP: Get edgy. Add another element of texture with interesting edges. It gives your album that touchability appeal.

MAKE IT TIP: Don't forget the date! You think you'll remember the exact date, but chances are you won't, right? Add the date so that you don't have to try to remember.

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## around the page

Make a dent in your supply stash and add all-important details with these inventive ideas for using embellishments. BY LISA DICKINSON

When it comes to designing a scrapbook layout, the key elements of any page are title, photo, journaling, and embellishment. In this issue's Around the Page we turn our attention to embellishments—those small accents that create big impact on your layouts. Let's take a look at three techniques to creatively incorporate lots of these lovely little decorations!



#### layout 1

**BORDER IT** Create a decorative page border with embellishments. Dig into that healthy stash of embellishments you've been hoarding for years and doll up your next layout. By printing a large photo, your border won't overpower the focal point. Instead, the flower-themed embellishment border complements the pretty carnation (and big smile!) in the picture.

#### **DESIGN TIP: Select** similar-themed embellishments

(in this case florals and nature-themed items) to create an interesting but coordinating page border.


#### **GRID IT**

Create a grid design with embellishments. You've probably used the grid design for photos when creating a layout, but how about using that same concept with your embellishments? Highlight a favourite photo with little bits and pieces surrounding it. One shaped die cut serves as an anchor for the title (with a matching arrow clip). The key to making this design a success is keeping the margins between each element the same resulting in a textural yet organized look.

#### **DESIGN TIP: Choose a neutral background**

to allow the photo and embellishment clusters to shine!

#### **FRAME IT**

Create a frame around your photos with embellishments. Place your photos, journaling, and title in the center of your layout, and surround these key elements with a circular frame. The stitching creates a unifying design to ground the elements and adds a wonderful handmade flair to the layout. Use coordinating embellishments from one collection and add enamel dots to fill small spaces.

**DESIGN TIP: To get a perfect circle, trace** around a bowl or a plate lightly with pencil. Use this line as a guide for your stitching

## creative cards

Where card makers come to share their love for techniques.

BY LAURA BASSEN

Laura Bassen here, and I'm so very thrilled to be contributing to this issue of Scrapbook & Cards Today! I absolutely love using metal dies for my cards. Dies add such a professional look to your designs, while adding dimension and versatility (hello!... you can die cut everything from felt to chipboard to cardstock). Dies can be expensive though, so I try to come up with new techniques to get as much mileage out of my dies as possible. I hope you will be inspired to try these fun die cutting techniques on your own projects!

#### card 1

#### **DOUBLE DIE CUTTING**

Take die cutting to the next level by adding a die-cut pattern to a large shaped die cut. For this design, I cut a triangle pattern from a large heart. It's a great way to add detail!

- Make card from cardstock. Trim strips of cardstock and adhere to card base.
- 2 Die cut triangle pattern from white card stock, and then die cut heart from diecut triangle piece.
- 3 Adhere triangle heart to card base with dimensional adhesive.
- 4 Die cut you from black cardstock and adhere with dimensional adhesive.
- Stamp and heat emboss sentiment on pink cardstock and adhere with dimensional adhesive.

**DESIGN TIP: With a bold, colourful** background, it's important to choose a chunky sentiment so it doesn't get lost in your design.

#### pretty amazing

supplies CARDSTOCK: Papertrey Ink, Simon Says Stamp; DIES, EMBOSSING POWDER, STAMPS: Simon Says Stamp; INK: Tsukineko; ADHESIVE: 3M



TIP: Cover plate dies are the perfect choice for this technique! Use a metal shim to get a crisp, clean cut with detail dies and thicker cardstock.





### card 2

#### STACK AND LAYER DIE CUTS

Get the most out of your nesting dies by layering them in a variety of colours to draw attention to your focal point and then partially die cut the fox for a seamless design.

- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Partially die cut fox outline from orange cardstock.
- 3 Partially die cut circle around the fox piece leaving the fox intact and creating a window.
- 4 Die cut rectangles from scarlet and purple cardstock and die cut circles from each panel. Set aside circles.
- 5 Layer and adhere panels with dimensional adhesive.
- 6 Die cut fox details from cardstock and assemble.
- Stamp and die cut bow tie and adhere with dimensional adhesive
- 8 Stamp sentiment and adhere panel to card base.

### wanna hug?

supplies CARDSTOCK: Neenah, Papertrey Ink, Simon Says Stamp; DIES, STAMPS: Simon Says Stamp; INK: Tsukineko; ADHESIVE: 3M, Ranger Industries

TIP: To partially die cut, position your die on the cutting plate so that only the parts you want to cut are beneath the plate. Use a craft knife to cut the tiny areas that your die cutting machine doesn't reach when partial die cutting.



#### card 3

#### INLAID DIE CUTTING

Die cutting from cardstock and then die cutting the same thing in a different colour of cardstock and placing it in the negative space is called inlaid die cutting. It's a super way to create a ton of interest while keeping a design flat.


- Make card from cardstock; trim and adhere cardstock panel to card base.
- Create focal panel following Step Outs on pg. 53.
- Stamp and heat emboss sentiment on cardstock, trim, and adhere to oval with dimensional adhesive.
- 4 Adhere focal point to card with dimensional adhesive and adhere sequins.

1 Die cut oval from pink cardstock and white cardstock. Set aside white oval to easily adhere your die cuts.



2 Die cut leaves from green cardstock.



3 Die cut leaves from pink oval and inlay green leaves.



4 Die cut love outline from white cardstock and love from black cardstock; adhere pieces together.



5 Die cut love outline from pink oval with leaves, inlay and adhere love.



6 Adhere inlaid pieces to white oval, and then adhere focal point to card base with dimensional adhesive.















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## design your story

Great tips and fantastic ideas for telling older, pre-scrapbooking era stories. BY CATHY ZIELSKE

I haven't been a scrapbooker for all my life. I'm quessing that many of you, like me, have stories that have never found their way into your albums. In this issue, I'll share a few ideas for mining the rich detail of our pre-scrapbooking lives and how you can incorporate older stories into your present-day memory keeping.



#### layout 1

#### WHAT CAN YOU RECALL? I met my husband 14 years before I made my first scrapbook page,

and I recently realized how few stories I've documented from our early years together—especially from the week that I first met him.

The photo on this layout is the first one I ever took of him and seeing it brings back such sweet and random memories from that very first week we met. Spend some time looking at an older photo and try to recall the little details. You don't have to remember everything to document a special story!

STORY TIP: Save the date. When creating a layout with an older photo, be sure to include the date of the photo and the date of the journaling. Showing that the journaling is reflecting on a story from days gone by is a wonderful way to add depth to the story.

### meeting dan

#### TYPOGRAPHY TIP: Pair two contrasting type styles together.

By combining a script font with an all caps font, I created a title with lots of contrast. Contrasting type styles engage the eye and add visual interest to any design.

#### layout 2

#### SURPRISE YOURSELF

The photo on this layout is one of my favourite shots of my daughter. She was two years old at the time, and as I set out to create a page about her at that time. I felt a rush of emotion that sent me in a completely different journaling direction. I simply went with it.

Sometimes an older photo can surprise you with unexpected feelings. It's okay to let yourself be vulnerable, especially as you make connections to where you are today with the benefit of hindsight.

As a middle-aged mama, I look back at the parent I was and acknowledge that I'm much better at it today, but I also want my children to know that I honour their experience, too.

#### STORY TIP: Be vulnerable.

Don't be afraid to share tender, honest stories. Life is such a wonderful, complex blend of positive, negative, and everything in between. Stories like this belong in our albums.



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## card café

Vibrant and textured autumnal cards to herald the gratitude of the season. BY LATISHA YOAST

There's something spectacular about fall—the crisp air, the changing colours of the leaves, and the warmth of a soft blanket. We're sharing ideas about how to bring the textures and thankfulness of the season into your card designs. A handmade card is like a warm hug that comes in the mail and is the perfect way to express gratitude.

#### card 1

- Make card from cardstock.
- 2 Die cut rectangle from patterned paper, trim strip of vellum, and adhere to rectangle. Adhere panel to card with dimensional adhesive.
- 3 Die cut circle from cardstock, stamp sentiment and leaves, and adhere with dimensional adhesive.
- Die cut leaves from white cardstock. blend ink onto leaves, and adhere with dimensional adhesive.
- 5 Tie twine in double bow and adhere.

#### TIP: Bring on the colours of fall.

For a perfectly coordinated card, choose ink to match the patterned paper, and use two or more colours of ink on each leaf to create depth. Use vellum to add interest and soften the plaid while still allowing the pattern to show through.

- 2 Wrap twine several times into a circle to create a wreath and adhere to card front.
- 3 Die cut leaves in various colours from felt and adhere.
- 4 Stamp sentiment with black ink on white cardstock and trim into pennant.
- 6 Mat pennant on patterned paper, trim, and adhere to card base with dimensional adhesive.
- 6 Adhere enamel dots.

#### TIP: Bring on the textures of fall.

Your metal dies can cut through more than just paper. Experiment with felt, burlap, canvas, etc. to bring texture to any project. This thank you card, with its textured felt wreath, is sure to warm the heart of the receiver.

- Stamp remaining images with black ink on white cardstock, die cut, colour, and adhere with dimensional adhesive.
- Tie twine in double bow and adhere.




